

Immunization Requirements 2021-2022

Texas law requires immunization compliance for all students to attend school.

Pre-K

4 Diphtheria/Pertussis/Tetanus

3 Polio

1 Measles/Mumps/Rubella² (after 1st Birthday¹)

3 Hepatitis B²

1 Varicella² (shot or history of Chicken Pox⁴) (after 1st Birthday¹)

2 Hepatitis A² (after 1st Birthday¹)

HIB (<5 years of age)

- 3 doses with one dose given after 12 months of age
- 2 doses if first dose was given at 12 - 14 months of age
- 1 dose if dose given on or after 15 - 59 months of age

Pneumococcal Conjugate (<5 years of age)

- 3 doses with one dose on or after 12 months of age, **or**
- 2 doses with both doses on or after 12 months of age, **or**
- 1 dose on or after 24 months of age.

Kindergarten-6th Grade

4 Diphtheria/Pertussis/Tetanus (1 after 4th Birthday¹)

3 Polio (1 after 4th Birthday¹)

2 MMR² (after 1st Birthday¹)

2 Hepatitis A² (after 1st Birthday¹)

3 Hepatitis B²

2 Varicella² (shot or history of Chicken Pox⁴) (after 1st Birthday¹)

7th Grade

3 Diphtheria/Pertussis/Tetanus (1 after 4th Birthday¹)

1 Tdap/Td booster (Tdap required if more than **5 years** since last dose of tetanus containing vaccine.)

3 Polio (1 after 4th Birthday¹)

2 Measles/Mumps/Rubella² (after 1st Birthday¹)

2 Hepatitis A² (after 1st Birthday¹)

3 Hepatitis B²

2 Varicella² (shot or history of Chicken Pox⁴) (after 1st Birthday¹)

1 Meningococcal (after 11th birthday³)

8th – 12th Grade

3 Diphtheria/Pertussis/Tetanus (1 after 4th Birthday¹)

1 Tdap/Td booster (Tdap required if more than **10 years** since last dose of tetanus containing vaccine.)

3 Polio (1 after 4th Birthday¹ /not required after 18 years of age)

2 Measles/Mumps/Rubella²(after 1st Birthday¹)

2 Hepatitis A² (after 1st Birthday¹)

3 Hepatitis B²

2 Varicella² (shot or history of Chicken Pox⁴) (after 1st Birthday¹)

1 Meningococcal (after 11th birthday³)

¹Receipt of the dose up to (and including) 4 days before the birthday will satisfy the school entry immunization requirement.

²Serologic evidence of infection or serologic confirmation of immunity to measles, mumps, rubella, hepatitis B, hepatitis A, or varicella is acceptable in place of vaccine.

³ If a student received the vaccine at 10 years of age, this will satisfy the requirement.

⁴ Previous illness may be documented with a written statement from a physician, school nurse, or the child's parent or guardian containing wording such as: "This is to verify that (name of student) had varicella disease (chickenpox) on or about (date) and does not need varicella vaccine." This written statement will be acceptable in place of any and all varicella vaccine doses required.
